





Couple look to **Newton for** mass production

New Jersey couple Thomas and Charlotte Santolli have developed a new design for liquor store shop-ping carts, which they believe will revolutionize the niche product.

Their story begins back in 2016, after Charlotte had become frus-trated with many of her wine bottles rolling around in her shopping cart, following a trip to the grocery store. She noted how easy it would have been for the bottles to smash into one another and break apart. After thinking this over the idea for the Wine and Cheer Cart sprang to her

mind, a shopping cart with sixteen, twelve, or eight bottle holders built in. After discussing this idea with her husband, Tom, their journey began.

Now, nearly four years later, their dreams are finally coming to fruition, as this past October the New Jersey residents' U.S. patent was finally awarded for their product. As Tom explained, he was told by a member of the patent office that it is often the 'simplest inventions that are the best," and by simply adding bottle holders to a shopping cart this product certainly qualifies. How-

ever, while simplistic in nature this product is backed by science to help increase the number of bottles pur-chased by using customers the **product.** As explained on the company website the shopping cart uses both the Zeigarnik effect and principles Gestalt influence cus-tomers to fill each of the bottle holders, resulting in more bottles purchased per customer.

So far, the couple have produced hundred units of their product but are looking to be able to produce their invention to be sold across the nation. Which is why the couple has set their sights on New-ton, the home of Technibilt, the nation's largest manufacturer of shopping carts. If two businesses were to combine, Newton would become the new source of a product that Thomas San-tolli describes as a shopping cart that creates a "stress free shopping experience."
